ADL and Aspen Institute Announce Inaugural Class of the Civil Society Fellowship

New York, NY and Washington, D.C., September 10, 2019 ... ADL (Anti-Defamation League) and the Aspen Institute today announced the inaugural class of the <u>Civil Society Fellowship: A Partnership of ADL and the Aspen Institute</u>. This new Fellowship, part of the Aspen Global Leadership Network, aims to prepare and engage the next generation of community and civic leaders, activists and problem solvers from across the political spectrum.

The 23 inaugural Fellows, selected from a pool of over 200 nominees from across the country, are journalists, entrepreneurs, government officials, lawyers, educators and designers. They work for nonprofits, private industry and in law enforcement. All are proven leaders with a broad array of concerns who have reached an inflection point in their lives where they are ready to apply their talent and skills to build a more civil society. A more civil society requires the participation and mutual understanding of all, regardless of political affiliation. The Fellowship is intended to ground this group of Fellows, all between the ages of 25 and 45, with a foundation to work toward a more civil society and discourse. The inaugural cohort reflects a diverse mosaic representing a broad geographical, political and ideological swath of the United States.

Civil Society Fellows will spend five weeks over the course of two and a half years in structured retreat – exploring their leadership, core values and visions for a more free, just and equitable society, as well as their desired legacies. Seminars created in text-based dialogue and

experiential engagement will take place in Aspen, CO, Washington DC, Europe, the Middle East, and culminate in the southern United States to explore how issues of freedom, security, liberty and diversity play out in different contexts.

Each Fellow will launch a leadership venture tackling a societal problem of their choosing that will stretch them and make a positive impact on their communities, their country and the world. Civil Society Fellows join the 3,000+ Fellows in the Aspen Global Leadership Network.

"At a time when our country seems to be more divided than ever and we are continuously presented with more and more complex challenges, it's vital that we bring together the next generation of diverse leaders -- individuals across the political and ideological spectrum -- in an effort to develop innovative strategies and solutions to those problems," said ADL CEO and National Director Jonathan Greenblatt. "ADL, along with our partners at the Aspen Institute, is incredibly proud to welcome this inaugural class of Fellows, who undoubtedly possess the potential and tenacity needed to combat the issues that consume our society today."

"The Fellows will work together in pursuit of broad-based solutions that will help address the challenges created by our divided political landscape," said Marc Rowan, philanthropist, co-founder of Apollo Global Management and the Fellowship's lead benefactor. "This group of Fellows will have the opportunity to come together in a non-partisan setting to exchange ideas and work on solutions to unite our country."

"The launch of the inaugural class of Civil Society Fellows is an important step in developing the type of optimistic, values-driven leaders America needs. The individuals selected represent a true cross section of American society who will make transformational differences in their communities and for our country. We are excited that, with our partners at ADL, we will help move these individuals from success to significance so that they might help build a more free, just, and equitable world," said Dan Porterfield, President and CEO of the Aspen Institute.

"They embody the ways in which we have more in common than what divides us. Most people in our societies are looking for ways to move us forward together. Having a multi-year endeavor like this Fellowship Program, working with groups of leaders over time, is vitally needed."

The combined approach of both committees ensures the non-partisan nature of the Fellowship in keeping with the Aspen Institute's tradition of values-based leadership development.
